Enclosed are two legally required annual notices – the **Annual Funding Notice** and the **Notice of Critical Status**. Both contain important information about the financial status of the American Federation of Musicians and Employers' Pension Fund (“AFM-EPP” or “the Plan”).

In August 2024, the Plan received approximately \$1.5 billion in Special Financial Assistance (“SFA”) through the American Rescue Plan Act (“ARPA”). The enclosed Annual Funding Notice shows the Plan’s funded status as of January 1, 2025 (the *beginning* of the Plan’s fiscal year that ended December 31, 2025). At that time, the Plan was 49% funded. However, this **does not** take into account the Plan’s SFA assets. **The funded percentage for the Plan including SFA assets would be approximately 88% for the 2025 Plan year.**

The enclosed Notice of Critical Status reports the Plan’s condition as of the Plan year that began January 1, 2026. Under the rules for receiving SFA, the Plan is deemed to be in “critical” status through the Plan Year ending 2051. During the period that the Plan is deemed to be in “critical” status, no matter its financial health, the Plan is required to provide a Notice of Critical Status annually, and the Plan’s Annual Funding Notices will describe the Plan as in “critical” status.
